Course Overview

The high school common core standards address six conceptual categories that provide a coherent view of college-prep mathematics - Number and Quantity, Algebra, Functions, Modeling, Geometry, and Statistics & Probability. The courses are designed to spiral through these categories in increasing levels of depth and rigor. In Common Core Math 1 (or Math 1), students were introduced to high school mathematics and the use of technology to address real world applications. Common Core Math 2 (or Math 2) builds on this foundation and starts to explore the mathematical underpinnings of things learned in the first course. In Math 2, students will go beyond rote use of technology to build a foundation of underlying mathematics. Following this course, students will advance to Common Core Math 3 (or Math 3), which will continue the spiraling through the six categories with advanced topics and development of mathematic proofs.
